

ASDC National Competition	The ASDC Finals is a high-tempo industry simulation event held annually over a weekend in mid-January. Finalists from the ASDC Qualifying Round are formed into aeronautical engineering companies, and are given a new RFT, with a brand new space settlement scenario. They then have 30hrs to meet these RFT requirements, and submit a presentation outlining their design.
